# The 1st Sunday of Advent at First Lutheran Church in St. Helens, Oregon Sunday, December 1, 2024, at 10:00 AM



Advent is about the "coming days." God's people have always lived in great expectation, but that expectation finds specific, repeated enunciation in the texts appointed for these four weeks. The ancients anticipated a "righteous Branch to spring up for David." The Thessalonians awaited "the coming of our Lord Jesus with all the saints." Jesus' contemporaries hoped for the time "to stand before the Son of Man." With them we eagerly await the coming days: another Christmas celebration, a second coming, and the advent of Christ in word and supper.

Jesus, we welcome your presence now with the lighting of this candle, whose flame brings warmth to winter and fills this place with the glow of hope. **Amen.** 



#### \*GOSPEL – Luke 21:25-36


The Good News of Jesus Christ according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**






- \* Invitation to Communion
- **About our communion practice:** All are welcome at the Lord's Table. The music ministers commune first, along with worshipers on Zoom. The communion server and pastor commune last. An usher will invite you forward, or you may request that Communion be brought to you.
- You may kneel or stand at the altar rail. Receive the bread in your hand or hands and eat it. Ask if you prefer a gluten-free wafer.

Take a cup of wine (red) or grape juice (white) from the assisting minister's tray and drink it.

- Your group will leave the table together after communing. Place your empty cup in the basket on the way back to your seat.
- We believe that Christ is truly present at the Lord's Table in the consecrated bread and wine, and Christ welcomes all who wish to receive the Holy Sacrament.
- Anyone who does not wish to commune is welcome to still come forward. Please signal your wish for a blessing by crossing your arms over your chest.
