FROM PASTOR ROBERT

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Now before faith came, we were imprisoned and guarded under the law until faith would be revealed. Therefore the law was our disciplinarian until Christ came, so that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer subject to a disciplinarian, for in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith. As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to the promise." (Galatians 3:23-29)

There is an "us versus them" mentality that plagues pretty much everyone in one shape or another. Every one pretty much has a "them" or "those people". "They" could be men, women, gay, straight, Muslim, Christian, Hindu, Buddhist, educated, uneducated, republican, democrat, Norwegian, German, Somalian, Iranian, Seahawk fan, 49er fan, etc....Yet how do we quit focusing on what divides us, and begin focusing more on those things that unite us. Unfortunately this is not very easy since socially we have been conditioned to focus on our differences. Whenever we walk into a room, whether it is conscious or not, we immediately begin to place people into the proper categories that we have been taught throughout our lives as we discern who would be the best person to speak to or avoid depending upon what we want addressed and what we might consider a threat. In some ways this can be a good thing. When you walk into a hospital you can pretty readily tell who the receptionist is, who the nurses are, and who the doctors are. This conditioning can also prompt us to pass judgement on people in particular situations as well when the individual has done little or nothing to deserve whatever judgement that we have made.

TV news, Reality programs, sitcoms, serial dramas, movies, etc..... each one consciously and/or unconsciously instill and reinforce stereotypes regarding the varied types of people in the world. Today it is even possible to completely surround yourself with a narrative that completely supports your particular point of view, and reinforces whatever bias you have toward those who you may disagree with. This constant reinforcing of stereotypes regarding those we disagree with, or are different than us, is so prevalent that when a television program, news story, or movie subverts an accepted stereotype then we are usually quite shocked, and it becomes its own news story. Whether we mean to or not, we then carry these stereotypes with us in the back of our mind shaping how we characterize, categorize, and utilize the different types of people we meet. All of this has another side effect, it causes us to dehumanize those around us.

Old Business:

- Update regarding 100-year anniversary event planning. Sandy reported that everything seems to be coming together, pastor has a beautiful service planned, and the program has been finalized. Still looking for volunteers.
- Discussion regarding updating the church website. Pastor Rob reported that Mark Hagelberg is keeping it up to date.
- Discussion regarding technology updates for Zoom worship – Mike reminded that the Zoom techs need to stay on top of updates.
- Discussion regarding safe money handling practices, the "Accounting Policies and Procedures" document, and purchase of a safe for the church office. Discussion was held earlier during "Priorities" section of agenda.
- Update on permanent nametags. Sandy Young reminded the council on the example of new permanent nametags that she sent out. The tags would be done on a computer program and held in place by a magnet. A discussion was held and the council approved the purchase.

New Business:

- Report from Ben Ruff on the Oregon Synod Assembly that was held via Zoom. He reported that the budget for the year was approved, representatives were elected for churchwide assembly in 2025 in Arizona, and he reported the Synod is conducting a fundraising campaign. A discussion was held on Synod needs.
- Jon reminded the council that any document for facilities use and weddings, etc. must use the wordage of donation or contribution as we cannot charge a "fee" and a stated amount.
- Discussion regarding updating the church directory. It was talked about and decided that an inhouse directory be done with a committee consisting of Kate Freitag, Jan Burdett, Linda McCoy and Sandy Young.
- Council approval to welcome Linda Easterling back to First Lutheran. Pastor Rob explained the situation to the council. And the council approved Linda as a member.
- A suggestion was made and brought to Audrey's attention that the wall ovens in the kitchen be removed as they are not being used. It was also suggested that the old cupboards be restained to match the new ones. This will be referred to Properties.


PASTOR ROBERT—CONTINUED

We then use these labels to reinforce why we dislike someone, or as a reason why we should avoid them. Yet what if I was to tell you that the person you dislike, the one that annoys and infuriates you is your brother or your sister, that each of us has a calling not to push them away but instead to embrace and move forward together. Of course there are times when this is impossible, when damage has been done between two people that is nearly insurmountable but for the vast majority of the things that separate us are relatively small and petty. Sure each of us make mistakes and act in ways that cause pain to others but each of us must also learn to forgive and move forward with the understanding that the person you have wronged or has wronged or annoyed you is a fellow child of God, (or if you prefer cohabitant on this great planet) and therefore you are both part of one body.
