God of might, we confess that we have sinned. We have turned away from our neighbors. We have trusted false promises.


God in our midst, we confess that we have sinned. We plead: come to us. Bring your mercy to birth in us.




SECOND READING – Philippians 1:3-11


You may kneel or stand at the altar rail. Receive the bread in your hand or hands and eat it. Ask if you prefer a gluten-free wafer.

Your group will leave the table together after communing. Place your empty cup in the basket on the way back to your seat.


We believe that Christ is truly present at the Lord's Table in the consecrated bread and wine, and Christ welcomes all who wish to receive the Holy Sacrament.

Anyone who does not wish to commune is welcome to still come forward. Please signal your wish for a blessing by crossing your arms over your chest.


